Lifting Authority (Competent Person) Training

BACKGROUND

Lifting and hoisting operations are one of the major causes of fatalities and serious incidents in global Oil & Gas (O & G) activities. Every type of lift has a set of risks that need to be managed if the lift is to be undertaken in a safe and efficient manner.

Despite the vast number of regulations, standards and guidelines that apply to lifting, incidents continue to occur. This document is based on LOLER and PUWER regulations for preventing fatalities and serious incidents. It is the O & G industry's expectation that all companies conducting lifting activities have a management system that includes specific procedures based on a full assessment of the risks and control measures required.

AIM

This aim of this module is to give the attendees an understanding of the Lifting Authority's responsibilities and how to fulfill them, prior to assessment.

OBJECTIVES

The intent of this module is to bring about a significant reduction in lifting incidents by highlighting the essential principles of safe lifting and encouraging their strict application to lifting and hoisting operations. This module describes lifting and hoisting safety elements to be incorporated into an organization's management system.

This module incorporates LEEA requirements.
